
So, we invited our Human Life Foundation supporters to submit their tributes to these everyday heroes, as well as those loved ones lost, but never forgotten.



About the Human Life Foundation . . .

Founded in 1974, the Human Life Foundation, Inc. is an independent, notfor-profit, non-sectarian organization chartered specifically to promote—and to help provide—alternatives to abortion. The Foundation seeks to achieve its goals through educational and charitable means, and welcomes the support of all those who share its beliefs in the sacredness of every human life (however helpless or "unwanted") and are willing to support the God-given rights of the unborn, as well as the aged, the infirm—all the living—whenever and wherever their right to life is challenged. All contributions to the Human Life Foundation are deductible from taxable income according to the Internal Revenue Code: Section 501 (c) (3). The Foundation, which is chartered in the State of New York, is not affiliated with any other organization or group.

The Days of the Good Samaritan

It is a question as old as humanity itself: "What would you do?"

Thinking people will fumble when answering this question: We feel a compulsion to weigh all the imagined characteristics of the situation, the possible circumstances and consequences, and the probable reactions of others. We may ask ourselves: Who am I? What do I stand for? How does that translate into action?

Consider the example of the three pro-life men who, on March 30 of this year, prayed for and offered counseling to women entering a Detroit, Michigan abortion clinic. What were they thinking? Should they risk exposure to the coronavirus in order to protest the state's cynical labeling of abortion services as "essential"? What about the risk of spreading the virus? What about the immediate plight of the babies? Live Action News reported that at least eight police officers confronted the men and ordered them to leave (April 3, 2020, https://www.liveaction.org/news/police-officers-abortion-business-pray-save-twins/). "The confrontation with police continued, but as the pro-life men began to pray for the officers—some of whom bowed their heads—they each began to walk away silently, one by one. By the end of the prayer, the police had left."

Heroes are not born, but made. They consult their consciences and learn from wise counselors. They are prepared, more than most, for the questions that lead them into decisive, moral action. Still, the questions never quite go away.

It was Jesus who presented our "What would you do?" conundrum in the most dramatic fashion. In the parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37), Jesus simultaneously appealed to our common sense of mercy and charity while challenging our precepts about moral obligation. The parable tells of a Samaritan, a Jew who rejected all but the most ancient form of the sacred Law, who stopped to provide extraordinary service to a robbery victim in critical condition. In stark contrast, a priest and a Levite, both fervent devotees to the accumulated Law, walked by on the other side of the road without giving assistance. Jesus seems to have implied that the priest and Levite interpreted certain precepts of the Law, such as the strict prohibitions on behavior during the Sabbath or regulations concerning interaction with a potentially dead man, in a way that appeared to bar them from engaging in merciful action.

Although this parable is often cited to reinforce our intuitive appreciation of charitable and merciful behavior, the most holy Jews of Jesus' time would have been perplexed, even dismayed. Jesus' evaluation of the characters in the parable was clear and also harsh; everything Jesus' audience knew about moral behavior was thrown into turmoil.

Situations of turmoil, of course, are where heroes shine. As the *New York Daily News* reported (May 26, 2020), the chaos of the coronavirus actually caused a reunion between nurse Dierdre Taylor and the fireman who saved her 37 years ago, when she was the age of four. Armed only with an axe and lacking a helmet, Eugene Pugliese, Jr. had responded to the pleas of Dierdre's mother to save

her baby first from a raging fire. Should the mother have saved herself first, then sent firefighters for her child? Should Pugliese have found a helmet before entering the burning building? Dierdre followed their examples in 2020 by traveling from her home in Virginia to help patients in New York City, the very heart of the COVID-19 pandemic. She shared a newspaper photo of Pugliese with firemen who were visiting hospital staff to give encouragement, and to their joy they recognized Pugliese right away. Taylor and Pugliese are now "virtual" friends, who will meet in person when safe to do so. Dierdre Taylor, her mother, and Pugliese are the kind of heroes we trust in facing the hard questions: What is a life worth? What is mercy worth? What would you do?

We need more heroes, especially the kind whose consciences are prepared to overcome base impulses and rationalizations alike. We need those who will meet the challenge Jesus laid before us, who will prioritize authentic mercy in the face of all of our society's excuses to demean, devalue, and even destroy persons appraised as less worthy.

In the pro-life cause, our light shines with understanding of the truth, found not only in our intellect, but also in our passion, faith, and will. We see the face of God in the eyes of our neighbors. They cry "mercy"! And with all our wisdom, prayers, and charity, we confidently reply.

In 2019, to help a global shortage of nurses, she created the Kay Carpenter Scholarship at Florida Atlantic University's Christine E. Lynn College of Nursing, which both funds aspiring nurses' educations and asks them to "pay it forward" and become donors to the fund themselves. She leaves her beloved partner of 20 years, B G Carter.
