About Our Honorees . . .

Thomas Brejcha is president and chief counsel of the Thomas More Society, a 25-year-old national public interest law firm defending high-profile prolifers like David Daleiden and Mark Hauck, as well as lesser-known Americans whose liberties are threatened by politically zealous prosecutors. A graduate of Notre Dame and New York University Law School, and recip-

ient of the Bronze Star for his service in Vietnam, Brejcha was for many years an anti-trust litigator at two private firms in Chicago. "Abortion was never [one of] my priorities," he once told a *Chicago Tribune* reporter. Then in 1986 came *NOW* v. *Scheidler*, a federal anti-trust lawsuit filed by the National Organization for Women, charging Chicago pro-life activist Joe Scheidler and other clinic protesters with conspiring to deny women access to abortion. "I was fascinated by the law involved,"



Brejcha said, "I just couldn't grasp how the anti-trust laws could be used to regulate protests." He volunteered to assist in Scheidler's defense but when after 10 years, and having become lead counsel, his law partners asked him to "quit the case or quit the firm," Brejcha had to "rethink things." As he recalled in the *Tribune* interview: "Suddenly your morals couldn't be pushed to one side of your law practice." He opted to quit and in 1998 founded the Thomas More Society. It took another 10 years and three trips to the Supreme Court before Joe Scheidler was finally vindicated. By then Thomas Brejcha was established as a passionate—and successful—defender of prolife and religious liberty causes. His article in the Summer 2023 issue of the *Human Life Review*, "*NOW* v. *Scheidler:* A Reminiscence," is an important contribution to the history of pro-life activism and one of the most infamous challenges it has faced down. Tom and his wife Debbie live in Evanston, Illinois, and have two adult children.

George McKenna is professor emeritus of political science at City College of the City University of New York and retired director of Office of Concern Food Pantry in Englewood, New Jersey, where he volunteered for 17 years (after 40 years in academe). The author of several books, including *The Drama of Democracy* (McGraw Hill) and *The Puritan Origins of American Patriotism* (Yale), Professor McKenna reset the abortion debate with his 1995 *Atlantic Monthly* cover essay "On Abortion: A Lincolnian Position," which was, "in its depth and insight," says Lincoln historian and former executive director of the congressional Abraham Lincoln Bicentennial Commission Michael F. Bishop, "a rare example of responsibly using history as a guide to the present." The essay was reprinted in the Fall 1995 issue of the *Human Life Review* and since then McKenna has been a steady and highly regarded contributor. In 2006, the *Review* was proud to pub-

lish "Criss-Cross: Democrats, Republicans, and Abortion." which the eloquent defender of the unborn, and sorely missed pro-life leader, Fr. Richard John Neuhaus called "about as fine a treatment of important aspects of how we got to where we are as I've ever read." Having asked McKenna to participate in several Review symposiums over the years-including one provoked by controversial remarks William F. Buckley made at our inaugural Great Defender of Life



dinner two decades ago—this year we turned the tables and asked several of our Great Defenders of Life to respond to provocative prescriptions the seasoned political scientist made in his latest essay, "Getting There," for how the pro-life movement should proceed now that *Roe* v. *Wade* has been overturned ("Where Do We Go from *Dobbs*?" Spring 2023). In the Summer issue, our new Great Defender of Life graciously addresses their yeas and nays. George and his wife Sylvia live in Tenafly, New Jersey, and have three adult children.

About Our Speakers . . .

Maria McFadden Maffucci is president of the Human Life Foundation and editor in chief of the *Human Life Review*, its nearly 50-year-old quarterly journal. Before joining her father J.P. McFadden's staff in 1990, she was managing editor at *First Things* and *This World*. When J.P. died in 1998, she assumed his editorial and managerial mantle, fulfilling her promise to keep the *Human Life Review* in print, which she has done, while raising three (adult) children with her husband Bob Maffucci.

W. Ross Blackburn, who lives with his family in Tennessee, has been a pastor in the Anglican Church in North America for 20 years. He has a PhD (Old Testament) from the University of St. Andrews in Scotland and has written articles for the *Human Life Review* and *Touchstone*, as well as educational materials for Anglicans for Life. Rev. Blackburn and his wife Lauren, married for 31 years, have shared homeschooling responsibility for their five children.

Ann Scheidler helped her late husband Joe Scheidler (the "Godfather of the Prolife Movement") found the Pro-Life Action League in 1980 and has worked to save unborn children through non-violent direct action ever since. Between 2000 and 2009 she served as the League's executive director and for the last several years as vice president. A passionate advocate of sidewalk counseling, she has shared her expertise in numerous appearances on radio and television. Mrs. Scheidler, who is chairman of the board of the Thomas More Society, is the mother of seven children, including Eric Scheidler, who currently heads up the League.

Anne Conlon came to the *Human Life Review* in 1995 as managing editor after a 12-year career on Madison Avenue as an advertising copywriter. She became editor in 2020, just in time for Covid, and has since worked from her home in Paxton, MA, to which she and her husband Raymond retreated during the lockdown. Their only child, Gabriel, a Capuchin friar, is blessedly stationed outside Boston, just 40 miles down the road.

From the Editors:

October 17th will mark the 25th anniversary of the death of our founding editor, James Patrick McFadden. We reprint here a column written at his passing by the late, great Cardinal John J. O'Connor (1920-2000) in (now, sadly, also late) *Catholic New York*, October 22, 1998.

Cardinal John J. O'Connor

T he only way I could have been at his Funeral Mass would have been to absent myself from another Mass reflective of everything he lived for. He would not only have objected; he would have censured me in his beloved *Human Life Review*. That is the quarterly publication Jim McFadden edited, arguably the finest collection of articles and commentaries on human life to appear anywhere in any language. The Mass I was already committed to celebrate on the day and at the very hour of his funeral liturgy was a Pro-Life Mass for high-schoolers. That is precisely what he would want me to be doing.

Jim McFadden's whole life was the cause of human life. I can perhaps best honor him by encouraging readership of the *Human Life Review*, which will certainly continue if its Executive Editor has anything to say about it. She is Maria McFadden Maffucci, master writer and editor herself, and equally passionate about the "cause." I have before my eyes as I write the Summer 1998 edition of the *Review*. Maria has provided a special section: "The RICO Outrage: Are 'Pro-Lifers Really Mafia Mobsters?"

What is RICO? As I have written in this space before, the Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act was drafted in 1970 to combat the activities of organized crime. A couple of FBI agents who have enough self-assurance to admit they are my friends were possibly the first to use RICO "big time," as we say. They put some highly deserving hoods very solidly behind bars.

Had my friends ever dreamed that RICO would be perverted to bring suit against "pro-life" activities, they would be at least as outraged as Maria McFadden Maffucci and the writers she has brought together in this issue of the *Review*. They happen to include the professor of law who authored RICO in the first place, for radically different uses. "Such a weapon of terror against First Amendment freedoms is not what I was directed (by Sen. John L. McClellan, of Arkansas) to draft in 1969. Had it been, I would have declined. It is a legal outrage that, at the behest of NOW, the federal judiciary is rewriting the law in a fashion that Congress, after careful consideration, specifically refused to draft in 1970." (G. Robert Blakey, O'Neill Professor of Law at Notre Dame Law School.)

The section on RICO is but a sample of the Summer or any other issue of the *Review*. Popular journalist Maggie Gallagher, for example, asks about the rights of live, frozen embryos, declared by a New York judge to be dead meat. Matthew Scully writes of "partial-birth abortion" under the apt title of "Partial Truth." Re-

flecting on the "ghoulish poster boy" for "assisted suicide," Jack Kevorkian, Wesley J. Smith does a brilliant piece under the title of "The Serial Killer as Folk Hero."

What size is an embryo's soul? How does one make prostitution for fun and profit respectable? Why love dare not lie? How are we slouching toward infanticide?

Then there are writers like Ellen Wilson Fielding (who tells us precisely why love dare not lie). Ellen not only shares her own sculptured prose with us in describing our current national shame; she calls on the prose-poetry of others. So, for example, in her own words: "Private and public bleed into one another. They are not watertight compartments—and certainly not now, when our ship of state has, like the Titanic, sliced open its hull on the black ice of modernity. In a more innocent era, a head of state might commit adultery and thereby sin, and experience guilt and moral discomfort. He might repent of it or he might persist uneasily, ashamedly. But he would know what he was doing and had done. He would be unable to defend it to himself as something other than the breaking of a vow and a trust."

Ellen turns then to Robert Bolt, author of A Man for All Seasons.

"[Thomas] More was a very orthodox Catholic and for him an oath was something perfectly specific; it was an invitation to God, an invitation God would not refuse, to act as a witness, and to judge; the consequence of perjury was damnation ... A man takes an oath only when he wants to make an identity between the truth of it and his own virtue; he offers himself as a guarantee. And it works. There is a special kind of a shrug for perjurer; we feel that the man has no self to commit, no guarantee to offer."

The last time I visited Jim McFadden in the hospital (his wife, Faith, was there, as always), cancer had consumed his larynx. He scribbled replies to my comments. I reminded him of how parched the throat of Christ had been on the cross. He didn't need the reminder. He was way ahead of me. I reminded him that in uniting his sense of powerlessness with that of Christ on the cross, he now shared the power of that same powerless Christ, the power to help save the world.

I saw him again not long ago, struggling but obviously not winning. I knew I

wouldn't see very much of him on this earth anymore. But for one who did so very much for the cause of human life, he deserved to live it to the fullest, and I am more than reasonably sure that is precisely what he is doing now. I wish he could write about it. Short of that we will continue to have the *Human Life Review*.
